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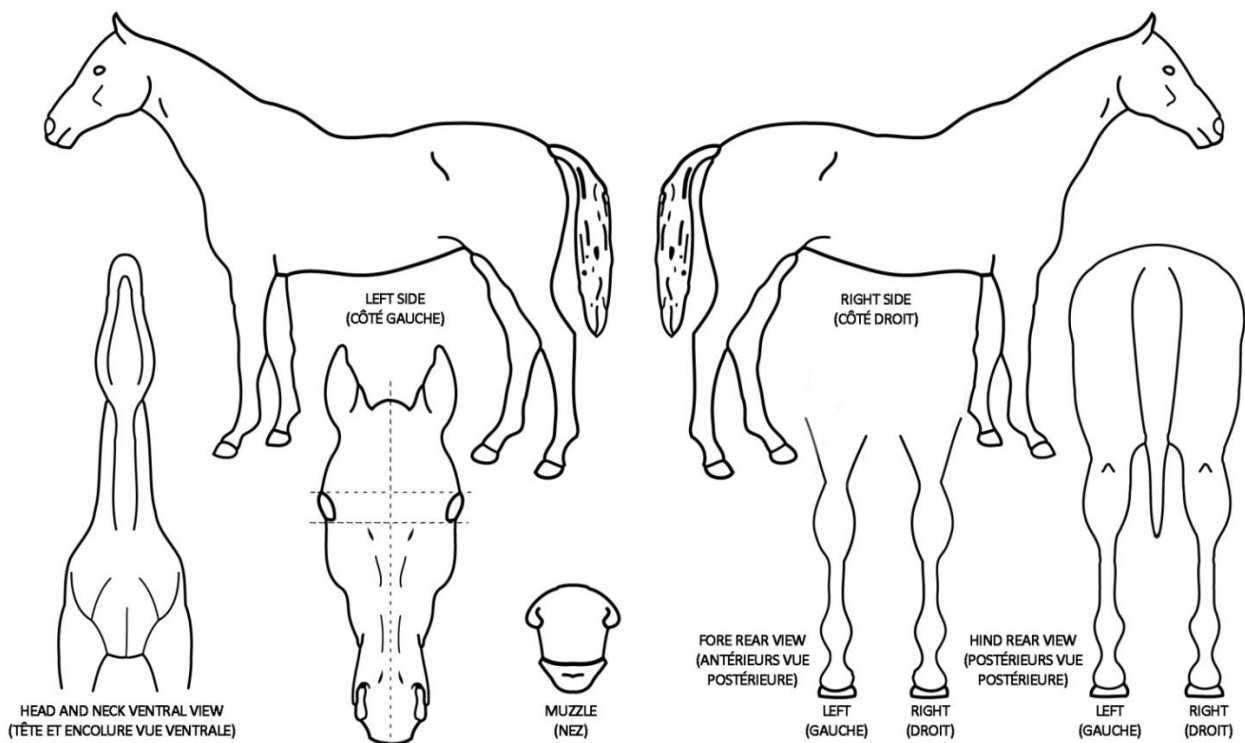

VETERINARY EXAMINATION AND COMMENTS

Each section should be completed with comments in the space provided please, but 'satisfactory' is acceptable as a minimum.

CONFORMATION

The breed conformation and type is entirely a matter for the society and it's judges. However, the general appearance and conformation on veterinary grounds should be studied for, eg: narrow feet, flat soles, pigeon toes, cow hocks, sickle hocks and any angular deformities of the limbs.

HEAD: Malformation of the teeth and jaw. (eg: Parrot Mouth)

EYES: Maldevelopment of the lens, iris or retina, cataract.

THROAT: Signs of operation for wind defects.

BODY: Evidence of being permanently affected with any contagious or infectious disease or umbilical hernia.

GENITALIA: For Stallions and Colts examine testicular size, texture and degree of descent, scrotal inguinal hernia.

LIMBS: Examination for evidence of narrow or flat feet, ringbone, sidebone, navicular disease, bone spavin and OCD. Allowance should be made for obvious injury.

WIND: The horse should be ridden or lunged, sufficiently to reveal evidence of possible pharangeal hemiplegia, and any other conditions of wind and heart

MOVEMENT The horse must be examined on the lunge or under saddle to assess all gaits for soundness. Appropriate flexion testing both before and after work should be used to assess soundness. Animals should be trotted up after a short period of rest to assess evidence of being affected with any disease or defect rendering them unsuitable for breeding purposes.

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It is emphasized that this is an external examination and does not include any examinations, pre rectum or any specialized techniques (eg: endoscopy, radiology or haematology). However where necessary to resolve doubt, and with the owners agreement, radiology or endoscopic examinations can be carried out. In case of lameness at the time of examination, the reasons must be given, and also if this is of a progressive or non permanent nature.
